- (2) All COB majors will be required to purchase LiveText's Accreditation Management System™ when enrolled in MG 320 (or GBA 300) to maintain a portfolio for assessment purposes. Please see course syllabi for details. LiveText will then be used in all core courses (MG 302, MG 320, MG 346, MG 350, MG 352, MG 390, MG 420, MG 480, MK 331).
- (3) Students who do not complete MG 320 at ASU are required to take GBA 300 Business Research Skills, a 1-semester hour course dealing with library research skills and business information sources.
