

When will I get my check?

• Any balance will be mailed to your address on file with the Admissions Office, in the second week of classes each term. Additional check runs during the semester are set by the Business Office. **No checks are mailed to students that have not attended class or participate in a DL course via Blackboard.**

How do I keep my aid?

• Comply with the Satisfactory Academic Progress Standards

> Maintain a 2.0 GPA

Successfully complete 67% of **all** coursework attempted. All W's, I's, F's and audited coursework count as unsuccessful completions. When unsuccessful completions exceed 33%, Financial Aid will be suspended until the student's completion ratio is again at least 67%.

Complete your degree requirements within 150% of the usual timeframe. Degrees at
> Athens State University require no more than 128 semester hours of credit. Aid eligibility expires after 192 semester hours attempted. All transfer work and courses attempted at Athens State University are counted in this calculation.

What happens if I drop classes or withdraw from school?

Change in enrollment status prior to term

If the federal financial aid student withdraws from some classes **prior to** the first day of class, the student is subject to a 100% refund to be returned to Financial Aid Sources. Financial aid is credited with all funds paid from a financial aid source and the federal financial aid student has no drops or unsatisfactory progress for the term.

Change in enrollment status during the first three weeks of the term

If a federal financial aid student registers for courses, pays and begins attending all classes, then has some circumstance that causes them to drop some of their classes, the federal financial aid student will be subject to the satisfactory progress standards outlined in the section HOW TO KEEP YOUR AID and the State Refund Policy.

Change in enrollment status during the fourth week through the ninth week of the term

If the federal financial aid student withdraws from some of their classes during the fourth through the ninth week of classes, the federal financial aid student will be subject to the satisfactory progress standards outlined in the section HOW TO KEEP YOUR AID.

Withdrawal from all classes prior to term

If the federal financial aid student withdraws from all classes **prior to** the first day of class, the student is subject to a 100% refund. Financial aid is credited with all funds paid from a financial aid source and the federal financial aid student has no drops or unsatisfactory progress for the term.

Withdrawal from all classes during the first three weeks of the term

If the federal financial aid student withdraws from all classes during the first three weeks of the term, the federal financial aid student is first subject to the Federal Refund Policy and then the State Refund Policy.

Withdrawal from all classes during the fourth week through the ninth week of the term

If the federal financial aid student withdraws from all classes during the fourth through the ninth week of classes the federal financial aid student is subject to the Federal Refund Policy.
