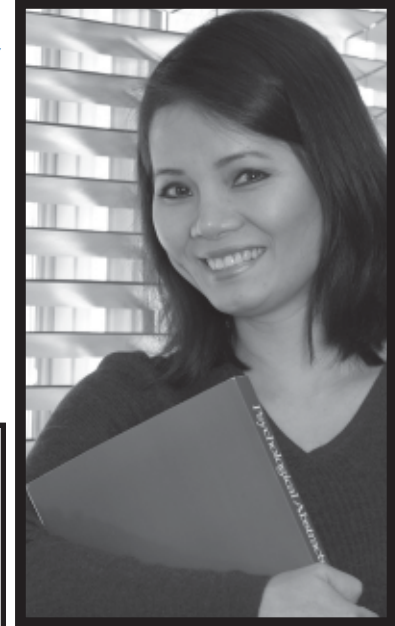

REFUND POLICY

IF YOU WITHDRAWwritten notification of withdrawal is required. WITHDRAWAL MAY BE MADE(1) in person, (2) by mail, (3) or by fax. (We do not accept telephone withdrawals.) ALL WITHDRAWALS REQUIRE STUDENT SIGNATURE. See University Catalog for complete policy.

The tuition and fees refund policy used by Athens State University is mandated by the Alabama State Board of Education. ASU is obligated to abide by the State Board Policy 803.02 dated 3-26-98. The following outline summarizes the State Board's regulations:

PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF SEMESTER .. 100% refund for any and all classes dropped.

DROP/ADD PERIOD:

Partial withdrawal - 100% refund, less 5% administration fee.
Complete withdrawal - 75% refund, less 5% administration fee.

1st WEEK AFTER DROP/ADD: (Aug. 29 - Sept. 4)

Partial withdrawal - NO REFUND.
Complete withdrawal - 50% refund, less 5% administration fee.

2nd WEEK AFTER DROP/ADD: (Sept. 5 - Sept. 11)

Partial withdrawal - NO REFUND.
Complete withdrawal - 25% refund, less administration fee.

IMPORTANT: There is no refund due to a student who partially withdraws after the official drop/add period. Refunds are calculated based upon the status of enrollment at the end of the third week of the semester. **The first day of class is defined as the day the semester begins, not necessarily a student's first class meeting date. There is only one "FIRST DAY" per semester. All refund checks will be "mailed" within three weeks from the first day of the semester.** For complete details, please refer to the actual refund policy printed in the college catalog.
